## Recovery from the family disease of alcoholism

The public is invited to the A.A. Conference with Al-Anon Participation, to be held on March 10 - 12 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Foster City. Attendees will hear first-hand accounts of how Alcoholics Anonymous can help alcoholics get and stay sober and how Al-Anon Family Groups can help families recover from the adverse effects of a family member's alcoholism, as well as improve the alcoholic's chances for recovery.

"The family is the support system that either is going to get healthier and help build a safety net, or the family is going to continue in patterns that are not so helpful to themselves, as well as to the person who is addicted."
