
#### **Conference Experiences**

#### <u>Archives Reprint</u> What Are Trustees, Anyway?

Right after the first AA members put their experience on paper (the Big Book) so it could be shared with far-away alcoholics, they entrusted it to a non-profit foundation.

The foundation is now called the General Service Board, and its members "Trustees". Nine are non-alcoholics, nine are AA members.

Each of these "trusted servants" spends about 14 day in New York every year to do his AA jobs. All serve without pay (This is truly minimum time.)

They are directly responsible to the AA groups. To whom they report each year at the G.S. Conference. As "trustees" they are expected to see that AA's world center of communication, GSO, really serves the groups and other alcoholics on the up-and-up. They are custodians of funds received, of the Twelve Steps, and Twelve Traditions, and are the "legal guardians" of the name ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS.

They have no power over any AA member or group. They endeavor to keep the AA name from being drawn into public brawls, and to protect the anonymity of AA members everywhere.
