

Updated NCCAA History Booklet Available!

As part of the celebration of NCCAA's 70th Anniversary, the NCCAA History Booklet has been updated to make the information more current and to reflect more recent history of NCCAA. The Northern California Council of Alcoholics Anonymous was an early pioneer in finding ways for our local fellowship to communicate and support each other. Alcoholics Anonymous co-founder, Bill W., was himself involved in the development of NCCAA and encouraged Northern California members to work together in organizing NCCAA events and conferences. The Hospital & Institution (H & I) Committee was becoming more organized at the same time, and H & I organizational meetings were often held in conjunction with NCCAA conferences - this practice often still takes place today. Recently, there has been an increase in Al-Anon participation and Spanish-language members. Efforts have been made by our current officers, and Steering Committee to encourage this participation and there are now liaisons to the Steering Committee from Al-Anon and Spanish-language members. The officers of NCCAA encourage participation and serve the fellowship in determining the direction of NCCAA's future.

Three Important Sessions Arranged; Chief Address to Be Tuesday Night

Hundreds of members of Alcoholies Anonymous, their relatives and friends, from Nevada on the east, Taft on the south, and Redding and Eureka on the north, will gather in San Francisco Tuesday, March 20, and Wednesday, March 21, for the largest mid-week meetings of AA ever held in Northern California. They will corne primarily to hear Bill W., surviving co-founder of their society of recovered alcoholies, Incidentally, they will link sessions of two groups set up within the parent body—the Fourth Annual Northern California. Nevada Conference and the first bisennial San Francisco Assembly (Panel 1) of the General Service Conference.

At Other Sessions

Bill will arrive here near the end
of a nation-wide tour, during which
he is assisting in setting up a new
body within AA—the General Service Conference. This conclave, to
be held in New York April 20, 21
and 29 will be composed of delebe held in New York April 29, 21 and 22, will be composed of dele-gates from half of the AA centers of the United States and Canada. The remaining half of the territory will be represented in 1952. From here he will go to Vancouver, B.C., for the last stop of his tour.

Tuesday afternoon he will attend the Fourth Annual Northern Calif-ornia-Nevada Conference from 1 to 5 p.m. in California Hall, Polk and Turk streets. He will make the closing remarks at that session.

For the Tuesday night program at the Opera House the chairman will be Ed A. of Alameda and an invocation will be delivered by Dr. Clarence Reidenbach of Oakland. Bill will be the only speaker. Admission to that meeting will be ticket only. No seats will be rese


